

"In The Shadows of Darkness" Oklahoma is Crumbling"

Exodus 20:16 "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour." It seems to be the simplest of commands, yet in our society this command is quite often ignored.

We have all faced situations where slander and falsehood have caused pain and suffering. Understand that while sometimes we know who is spreading lies, sometimes the talebearers may be unknown.

Even though we may never see justice served upon those who play the role of talebearers, rest assured God will faithfully pass judgement. We must accept that this judgement may or may not occur this side of eternity.

"A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaketh lies shall not escape." Proverbs 19:5.

"A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaketh lies shall perish." Proverbs 19:9.

Some reading this may not accept the teachings of scripture, but rest assured, it will not change the inevitable outcome. Most of us can remember back on the days of school and realize the cruelty of intentionally misspeaking words. Attacks on character or purity often caused the recipient to retreat into the shadows hiding the shame that was heaped upon them.

It does not matter if something spoken is true, only that the hearer believes it to be true. The saddest thing about gossip is people's willingness to believe what they hear without investigating the truthfulness of what was spoken.

Even as adults we face outright lies in the workplace as well as in our day to day lives. Families have been destroyed, jobs have been ruined and lives lost because of gossip.

God's word clearly gives wise counsel as to how to approach these matters.

2 Corinthians 13:1 says, "This is the third time I am coming unto you. In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established."

As our own government was established, this became an integral part of our judicial system. There needs to be witnesses and the accused has the right to face his accusers. We should never place judgement on someone who was accused in the cloak of secrecy. We must always consider the source of an accusation and the credibility of the source.

In school, children were emotionally destroyed because someone used words as a weapon. We call it bullying and there have been lives lost because of hateful discourse. One would hope that we would outgrow such evil behavior, but unfortunately this isn't so.

Before I address the main purpose of this article, I want to point out something that is often overlooked. That is the people who enable and empower the people who wish to deceive and lie.

If people would not listen to, or respond in ways that give the talebearers power, they would eventually go silent. Imagine their shock if they would be called out on their gossip and hate speech.

Furthermore, if we would quit repeating unverified and/or unnecessary information many reputations and emotions would be spared.

So I implore you, do not start or spread gossip, nor give gossip space in your mind's garden affording it the opportunity to grow.

Now getting to the heart of this article and that is how lies are destroying our state, and our nation. I am particularly referring to lies in the political arena.

Somehow people think just because someone is a public figure, they are open targets or fair game for character assassination.

If people were held accountable for what they say, and the ads that are run, maybe they would stick to the facts. This year we had incumbents who were stellar, absolutely fantastic in their voting records. They were defeated because of lies and character assassination.

We had some really qualified candidates who ran for office, and they were defeated because of untruthful ads.

Let's now look at a concept that is referred to as dark money. If individuals run political ads, they must disclose who they are and whether the ad was approved by a candidate.

In this country we have the right to free speech, however, we cannot speak lies that will slander someone. Understand the Constitution protects God given rights that were given to the individual.

Now we have corporations and other groups that are assuming they can say whatever they want, with impunity. There is a level of accountability if a corporation is known, and the members are known.

This is also true for groups that have known memberships and a record of those who give financially. We must know

Apparently Jesus is a "door knocker", knocking on the door of our hearts to invite us into fellowship with Himself! He also promised us that if WE will "knock...it shall be opened unto you." (Matthew 7:7)

Recently we have been taking teams out into the neighborhoods of Norman to "knock doors", and we have been seeing this promise fulfilled –open doors! As we have been going out, we have had opportunities to pray, encourage, and share the gospel with several people.

Steve and Luis have been doing some outreach, as well as Sue, Natalie, Evelyn, and Rebecca. Not only folks from our church, but Chris, a meteorologist from the National Weather Center and his friend Larry have been joining us to learn how to do evangelism. That makes three and possibly four evangelism teams that we are sending out from our little church, which all started with Steve who began doing evangelism and then inviting me along with him to work together seven years ago!

We have had some divine appointments in these recent efforts! One was an 84 year old man named John who had been a widower for 22 years. As you can understand, he was probably experiencing some loneliness, so he invited us in for an extended conversation about the gospel and prayer!

He was a man that was struggling with faith and had been for many years. He said "I have been praying to God for 40 years that I would believe." So, I said, "well, here we are, the answer to your prayer!"

He did not receive Christ that day, but he is open to us following up with him again.

After meeting John, I was struck by the idea that there are probably millions of others like him who are struggling with having faith in God and withering away in their homes. They are not only open but eager, even desperate, to have a spiritual conversation if we would simply go out into the community and "knock".

God does not desire that any should perish, but do we!? It will require millions of workers to be sent into the harvest if we will fulfill the heart of God to minister to all of these lost and lonely people!

There was also another John that we met through neighborhood outreach just this past Wednesday. We had been knocking several doors without a good conversation, but then Larry said, "Let's do one more house."

It's a good thing he did, because the LORD definitely provided a divine appointment!

We met John and his wife Liz who have two kids and attend Antioch church. What really caught my attention was how familiar John looked to me, so I asked him, "Did you live in Oklahoma City and go to P.C. North high school? He said no, but his wife did! She graduated two years before me!

I found out John, on the other hand, grew up and went to school in Edmond, but he attended OU and did a lot of evangelism in the OU dorms.

I then remembered that it was my freshman year at the Adams dormitory at OU that a couple of older college guys knocked on our door which we opened and allowed them to come in. I was not yet a Christian at the time so it was very urgently needed that someone was willing to knock on the door to share Jesus with me!

I told John that night, you remind me of the guy that was trying to reach me through personal evangelism! He couldn't remember, it was 19 years ago...but was John the one that came to my dorm room that day to share the gospel or someone that looked just like him?

Well, it certainly gave me chills and goosebumps thinking that it might be a possibility that I was now standing at and knocking on HIS door!

Whether it was John, or someone else, or an angel from heaven that visited me that day, that was the first time that I can remember that someone had compassion to share the word of God with me, a complete stranger!

There were others who planted and watered and reaped, but it was God who gave all the growth!

What a reminder that day was to me, that if we will be faithful to sow the seeds of the gospel with the lost who desperately need it, we might discover that one day they have become evangelists that are sowing seeds themselves, making disciples, and continuing to multiply the fruit of our labor for the glory of God!

First Thessalonians 5:11 says, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up as you are already doing."

The times we are living in right now are difficult. The last two to three years have been one of the most difficult seasons I can remember. So many are struggling, and depression is becoming more and more of a challenge. Antidepressants are now the most widely prescribed drug in the U.S. according to *Therapy Culture*.

Pastors and leaders are not immune to the clutches of disappointment, discouragement, and depression. Yet Paul, in light of the Day of the Lord coming, says "Encourage and build each other up."

Our world has produced a complete lack of trust, conspiracies galore, and polarizing viewpoints. Every word spoken is scrutinized, every decision is challenged, and even our motives are questioned if you dare to disagree.

Remember that the real enemy is Satan and we are called to be different by encouraging one another and seeking to build up one another. Let's challenge ourselves to not allow the gripe-y, negative, ever-complaining culture around us to infiltrate our church families.

Hebrews 10:24 says, "And let us be concerned about one another in order to promote love and good works."

Encourage someone! God placed us in a church family not to tear one another down but rather to build one another up.

Who do you need to encourage today? To whom do you need to say thank you? Who comes to mind that you need to call or text and express your appreciation for what they mean to you?

Everyone needs encouragement now and then, and our church families should be the best examples of godly encouragement.

Hebrews 10:25 says, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."

Jesus was continually encouraging and challenging His disciples in their faith journey. He spoke the truth and did not back off the reality of the situation but encouraged them.

He did not tell them that everything was going to work out how they wanted or that there would never

be difficulty and tribulation. There was no promise that it would always be smooth sailing, but He did say in John 16:33, "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world."

Even in the midst of tribulation God's peace is available.

Encourage means to pour courage into, so who needs to be encouraged today? Who is struggling right now?

All of us could use some building up and to be reminded that we are not alone and God is still in control. This is the importance of community and being connected to a church family spiritually, relationally, emotionally, intellectually, and physically.

We need to see one another, spend time with one another, encourage one another, and build up one another. Fight the temptation to focus on yourself and begin by focusing on others who need encouragement.

During challenging seasons, the goal is not keeping up with the times but rather keeping up with Jesus. How do we do that?

According to First Thessalonians 5:8 we put on the armor of faith first. We approach these uncertain times and the future with a faith-based rather than fearbased attitude.

Find encouragement in God's Word where over and over when His people faced insurmountable odds they were told, "Do not be discouraged! Do not be



afraid!" What was happening? Courage was being poured into them by

trusting in the Lord instead of how things

appeared to be. Fear is real, but never forget that God is able.

First Thessalonians 5:8 also says to put love on our chests. Outrage is not a strategy, and while what you are standing for is right you may not be standing for it in the right way. These are some of the most difficult times culturally to navigate.

The real challenge forging ahead will be navigating these difficult times by showing compassion without compromising convictions and standing for biblical convictions without compromising compassion. Encourage one another by showing the same grace you desire when you are the one who has sinned. We all need grace and let's encourage one another with that truth.

Then Paul tells the church in Thessalonica to put on a helmet of the hope of salvation. Faith is the substance of things hoped for, and that means we must distinguish between our present state and our future fate.

Our future fate is not determined by the times we live in, the culture we are enduring, or the difficulties of our situation.

Do not forget that God enjoys working through the critical mass of two or three. He does some of His best work in the worst places and during the most difficult times.

Be encouraged by Romans 5:8 that says, "But God proved His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

The challenge is for us to encourage one another and build one another up. I don't know about you, but I could use a little building up right now. You do not go through the battles unscathed. They weigh on you, pull you down, and impact you spiritually, emotionally, and even physically.

Maybe we need to begin by repenting of our bad attitudes and seek the mind of Christ.

The first work of grace is the first word of grace: Repent.

It begins with a change of heart that leads to a change of behavior. To repent means that you adopt God's viewpoint over your own. Even your attitude. Encourage someone today with these words!

Nostalgia can be a lot of fun, but it can also be paralyzing. When we worship the past and how things used to be, we miss out on the opportunities before us right now.

The future is always moving toward us, and while it is quite uncertain, we must prepare for and plan how to connect with it.

How will we engage our culture in the future with Christianity no longer the default identity? Maybe we are a bit spoiled by having home field advantage for so long?

It will be more costly to be a Christian and stand for Christian values in the future. But God's churches will always have a future when they look to Him, trust Him, obey Him, and follow Him. In *Rings of Fire* Leonard Sweet states, "The divine seems to enjoy working through a faithful remnant, the critical mass of two or three ..."

No matter how bad culture gets, will He find us faithful when He returns? We should not be shocked knowing the depravity of man. None us imagined our society would be where it is today, but we are here "for such a time as this." God placed us right here, right now, so let's not miss this opportunity.

Following Jesus requires studying the future. The apostle Paul spoke of pressing towards the mark of the prize of the high calling. The writer of Hebrews said he was looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith.

You are called to finish well no matter the circumstances, the environment, or the level of persecution that may occur. The challenge of the future will be showing compassion without compromising convictions and standing for our convictions without compromising compassion. It is not easy, but we are called to love our enemies and to pray for those who persecute us.

This is Leonard Sweet's challenge: "The church spends more time slandering its moment than in savoring and saving its moment. If we loved the world as God so loved the world, we would love it well and love it to life."

This is not a call to water down the Word or cower from the truth. Rather, Sweet exhorts us to "not be afraid of antifragile preaching."

Preaching repentance calls for a change of heart, behavior, and being, but if that does not occur we are called to continue. Ezekiel was told by the Lord that people would not listen to him anymore than they listened to God.

"Remember that the real enemy is Satan and we are called to be different by encouraging one another and seeking to build up one another."

Jesus commanded us to occupy until He comes. He did not call us to a life of isolation or compromise, but to live in the world and not be of the world. It is not easy, but once again Sweet sheds some light on what that might look like: "Whoever your author is will be your authority."

We must allow God to author our story and let the Holy Spirit to be our editor. He continues, "We have no interest in keeping up with the times but rather keeping up with Jesus and opening up to God's presence in the times we're in." Are we in step with living out God's mission? How do we lead into the future?

First, we stay in step with Christ allowing Him to direct our paths. We make sure every initiative we pursue is God-initiated. We listen to the Holy Spirit and obey his direction.

Are you quenching the Holy Spirit's power in your life and in your church by focusing on what you want and desire more than His command to make disciples?

Have you so focused on the sins of commission that the sins of omission go

unnoticed?

Are you willing to go through the doors He opens?

Are you looking to escape, or are you actively engaging the lost?

We lead into the future by **showing love and compassion**. You cannot escape the culture God has placed you in, nor should you. Seek and search for ways to demonstrate the love of God in practical ways.

Leonard Sweet says, "Having culture as a bosom buddy can lead to collusion (or syncretism). Having culture as an enemy can lead to condemnation. Having culture as a companion on your journey can lead to its own problems."

Loving the people in your culture means you declare the unknown God as Paul did in Athens in Acts 17. Figure out more ways to build relationships in order to have gospel conversations.

Leading into the future will require figuring out how to once again reproduce and multiply. With most churches struggling, not growing, and not multiplying, what will we do about this reproductive crisis?

When a species cannot reproduce itself, we classify it as endangered. Are you making disciples, reproducing leaders, and multiplying small groups and/or churches?

The two greatest dangers in any church are an unwillingness to evaluate and to do anything about that evaluation. The only thing worse than having a problem is the failure to be aware of the problem you have.

Churches are entering some of the most culturally difficult times to navigate. Western culture is focused on selfdetermination and individual personal freedom.

The secular world says only you can determine who you are, what you do, and how you live. These ideas are celebrated but ignore the truth of God's authority over us.

Evaluate your church's present state then compare it to its potential fate. Without Him you do not stand a chance, but He does some of His best work in some of the hardest places and times.

"Knowledge"

A very wise person once said even the most intelligent of us is unintelligent in some areas of life. I've found that to be truth.

While such a statement appealed to my pride and ego, I knew there was still a lot I didn't know about the Bible. But I've never forgotten the overwhelming awareness of responsibility that swept over me when he said that.

He was correct that knowledge of God's Word is like the Pearl of Great Price of Mathew 13:45-56 which Jesus said the man sold all he had in order to buy.

However, knowledge of the Word of God is not to be the final result. Seemingly the greatest goal we could have in life would be to know all we could about the Word of God, but along with the gaining of knowledge is the great responsibility to share it with others.

Along with the responsibility to share though comes the responsibility to share it responsibly.

James declared, "My brethren, be not many masters, knowing that we shall

receive the greater condemnation."

Literally, James has declared we teachers will be judged by a higher

standard and with greater severity than other people, so we assume the greater accountability and the more condemnation.

The Apostle Paul declared in 2 Timothy 2:15, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
