I strongly recommend that all people look up Agenda 21 on the website un.org.

Some of us have heard about the 2030, or the 3030. To most people it seems like some random set of numbers that has little relevance to us.

Truth be told governments worldwide are invoking plans to control all of humanity. In the United States there is a concerted movement to force people to live within 15 minutes of "smart cities".

Our government knows that electric vehicles will greatly diminish an individual's ability to move freely within the country. The 3030-land grab is designed with the intention of granting ownership of 30% of America's land to the federal government.

When we attempt to determine how governments will accomplish these goals, we have to interpret the facts we know and speculate on the ultimate conclusions of these facts. We must remain ever vigilant to the fact that government is not our friend. In order to accomplish their goals, governments must remove our freedoms as well as take away our abilities to defend ourselves.

Presently, here in Oklahoma, we see cities and counties being introduced to "guides for growth". On the surface one may conclude that these are just benign and organized ways to effectively and efficiently have organized growth within our communities.

Upon closer examination we see that these "guides" come with very troubling conditions attached.

Some of you may know that I serve on the city council in Pryor Creek. We have been presented with one of these "guides" as a gift from the Mid America Industrial Park. They helped develop these for several communities within our county.

There is some very troubling verbiage within the document presented to Pryor. Words such as "actionable" indicate

"The UN wants us to have a one world society, and individuality is not conducive to their plans." that there could be forced compliance if we agree to such plans. They can become legally binding upon the adopting communities and outsiders can make changes that will become enforceable.

Rogers County has one of these plans being considered that changes the county into a socialist society. People who have farmed for years or raised livestock will now have to get permission to use water from streams that cross their property.

Pryor's proposed guide will tell us which



land can be developed. land which is agricultural, and which land can b e environmentally protected. The citizens of Pryor should be responsible for Pryor, and the citizens of Rogers County should be responsible for themselves.

Another great concern is the intention to tax people not for the value of the property as it is currently being used, but according to the value of the intended use.

This would financially force people to sell family land that was used for generations as agricultural that would be worth more developed. The adoption of these guides automatically puts restrictions on individual choices and liberties.

These guides are assisting the UN and the federal government in asserting more control over the people. I am not going to try to give a comprehensive overview, but just an introduction.

Below are some quotes regarding the Agenda 21 taken form the UN webpage. I will insert some comments to show why these quotes can be so alarming.

Preamble

This Agenda is a plan of action for people, planet and prosperity. It also seeks to strengthen universal peace in larger freedom. We recognize that

To edify means to build up. Quite the contrary to tearing down with sarcasm and foul language.


When our words are edifying, we will be a tremendous blessing to those in

Nothing could have been more irritating than the 12 disciples, yet Christ kept a good attitude with them.

On a scale of 1-10, based on your attitude, especially in stressful circumstances, how much God is in control of your life? Without Him there is no way we can consistently do right and live a godly life, no matter how hard we try.

It is important to remember our attitude represents God's attitude to those around us and we may be their only ambassador for Him!

If we are putting God first in our lives, then our desires will be the same as His. Then when Ms. Critical, Mr. Gripey, or our perfect plans are disrupted by that thing called "life", we will be able to RESPOND in grace instead of REACT in irritation.

Satan of course has his dirty paws in the big middle of all of this. A consistent bad attitude leads to discouragement which this leads to hopelessness. This is why those with negative attitudes battle depression.

All he has to do is add a dash of 'self-pity" to set rotten attitude in concrete, making it a permanent part of their lives. It won't be long before those with a bad attitude also develop a "chip in their shoulder." All this is VERY heavy to carry around!

So what do you do if you have a rotten attitude? How do you change?

PRAYER

CBC Hosts 4th Annual Scholarship Gala

Central Baptist College hosted its fourth annual Scholarship Gala on March 28. The black-tie optional event featured keynote speaker, Harry Miller, and was held at the Conway Expo Center.

The proceeds of the event benefit student scholarships, and Central Baptist College President Terry Kimbrow announced \$1,085,208 had been raised through event sponsorships and private donations.

The theme of the event was "Fearless Faith" and the program focused on the mission and ministry of Central Baptist College which is "the integration of Christian faith and academic excellence in a Christ-centered environment."

The emcee for the night was Yalanda Merrell, Director of Audience Engagement at Lifeword.

Following the opening prayer by Dr. Larry Henderson, Central Baptist College Chaplain and Therapist, guests were served a three-course meal by CBC Dining Services, under the direction of Chef Billie Rodriguez.

The highlight of the evening was an interview with Harry Miller facilitated by Yalanda Merrell. Harry is an Ohio State student who announced last year that he was medically retiring from football due to declining mental health.

Harry shared his amazing testimony of living through times of deep depression and thoughts of suicide. When he medically retired from football, he said people would say, "What's wrong with Harry?"

He was at the height of his football career, NFL agents were recruiting him, and he was a 4.0 Mechanical Engineering major.

On the outside, he seemed to have it all together. On the inside, however, he was falling apart.

Miller talked about how God has worked in his life over the past year bringing him to the realization, "I have a



story that must be told." He was asked about what a "hero" looks like to him. His response, "Kids have all these posters of these athletes who are big and muscular and in these beautiful poses that make them look strong and powerful.

I'd like to see a poster of Michael Jordan sitting on the curb crying." He said, "That's the kind of hero I want." At the end of the interview, Harry received a standing ovation from the over 400 attendees of the Gala.

The Central Baptist College Fine Arts department provided the entertainment. The Central Baptist College Choir, under the direction of Mr. Jim Turner sang Fearless Faith. Words were written by Christine Harris, wife of alumnus David Harris, and the musical score was written by Mr. Jim Turner, Assistant Professor of Music.

In his announcement of the \$1,085,208 total that had been raised through this event for student scholarships, President Kimbrow acknowledged 57 event sponsors, and many additional individuals and businesses who made contributions towards the total.

"I am beyond grateful for the generosity of so many," said President Kimbrow. "The Central Baptist College Board of Trustees, businesses, not only in Conway, but across the state of Arkansas, and other individuals who are such faithful supporters of Central Baptist College all came together to make this an unforgettable night for the support of Christian Higher Education."

Lately, I find myself wondering more and more about more and more things. I recently was privileged to listen to a country western radio station.

The song being played was, "I Shoulda Been a Cowboy," or whatever the official name is.

My cousin was a true cowboy. He worked on a large ranch, and from what he told me, it was much the same as what we did, only a lot more of it. They fixed a lot of fences, dug a lot of post holes, chopped a lot of wood, dug a lot of ditches, pulled steers and cattle out of mud holes, and delivered a lot of calves.

Even though I never broke a horse as he did, it didn't sound all that exciting or desirable for me.

On the ranch where he worked they even had pigs that need tending and

eggs to be gathered. (Where do the movie producers think the cowboys got their bacon and eggs?) My cousin carried

a rifle with him on his horse, but he only used it to shoot snakes, coyotes

and varmints. When he went to town it was to buy ranch supplies and he would have been fired had he gone into the saloon to wash the dust out of his gizzard.

Most of the cowboys didn't have any more money than we did and if they wanted to eat, they wouldn't waste their money in a saloon.

If the one singing, "I Shoulda Been a Cowboy," really wanted to be a cowboy of the old west, he probably should go sign on at a modern day ranch. He would probably find it was a lot of hard work with very little glamour, just as it was in the old west. He would probably change his tune to "I shoulda been anything BUT a cowboy."

> With the modern day headlines we've all probably wanted to sing, "I shoulda been born a hundred years ago." However, I doubt I would be any happier in an any other era than this one, because they had problems we certainly don't have to contend with.

I remember paying a

nickel for a very large Baby Ruth candy bar when I was a boy. I would sure like to be able to do that again. But I also remember I got paid a penny a bale for hauling hay. So I had to haul five 50 to 80 pound bales for that candy bar.

Maybe the singer "shoulda been a cowboy," but he's not, he's a singer. He and the rest of us need to serve God whatever our occupation.
